New Years Reflections by Pastor Dave

As the New Year begins, many of us are in the habit of making New Year's resolutions. This is a good habit which helps many set goals for the New Year. As Christians our main goal should be to conform more to the image of Jesus. So here are 12 Christ-like characteristics we can resolve to increase in our lives for in the New Year. (adapted from an article by Denise Kolmyer of Unlocking the Bible)

1) LOVE: This is by far the most defining characteristic of Jesus. Throughout his earthly ministry he exuded love to everyone he encountered. As Christians, love should be our distinguishing characteristic, as well. "Everyone will know that you are my disciples if you love one another" ([John 13:35](#))

2) COMPASSION: Compassion is borne out of love for others. It means "to suffer together." Compassion compels us to come alongside and partner with someone who is suffering, whether physically, emotionally, mentally, or spiritually

3) FORGIVENESS: Forgiveness is why Jesus came to earth, to die on a cross so that we could be forgiven of our sins and our relationship with God is wonderfully restored. It is the same with our earthly relationships. Unforgiveness keeps us separated, but forgiveness reunites us. Forgiveness heals fractured relationships.

4) HUMILITY: Humility means "lowliness of mind, modesty." As the saying goes, "It is not thinking less of yourself, but thinking of yourself less." Humility is a mindset, an attitude, the opposite of pride, "haughtiness, disdain and arrogance. If you humble yourself, he will lift you up. (James 4:10)

5) OBEDIENCE: Just as compassion is an outgrowth of love, obedience is an outgrowth of humility. "He humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross" ([Philippians 2:8](#))

6) PEACEMAKER: Isaiah said that one of the names of Jesus would be "Prince of Peace". Jesus offers this peace through the cross. His broken body tore down "the dividing wall of hostility" between God and us. Jesus then say's "blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God". (Matthew 5:9).

7) SERVANTHOOD: The life of Jesus was one of sacrifice and service. His death on the cross was the ultimate act of service to mankind. He claimed that he came "not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many" (Matthew 20:28).

8) PRAYERFUL: Prayer is to exchange our own wishes (our wills) for God's. In Gethsemane Jesus asked the Father to take away the cup of death, but ultimately prayed "...yet not my will, but yours be done (Luke 22:42. Let your prayer life conform to God's will.

9) AVAILABLE: We are often consumed with our own lives and schedules that we forget about those around us that are hurting and in need. Jesus 3 year ministry was focused on being available to the needs of others. People could come to him at anytime and they did by the thousands.

10) TRUTHFUL: God the Father cannot lie, and neither can Jesus, God the Son. Unlike Jesus, however, we can lie, exaggerate, bend the truth. It is part of our sinful nature. Yet, believers are called to "take off your old self with its practices...[and] do not lie to each other" ([Colossians 3:9](#)).

11) PATIENCE: When the confused disciples couldn't grasp the meaning of the parables, became annoyed by people wanting more of Jesus time. When they didn't fully understand the mission of why Jesus came, Jesus patiently explained them. Praise God that he is patient with his stubborn, errant children (Psalm 103:8)

12) HOLY: Holiness is more than a moral code to follow. Our moral behavior is an outgrowth of a holy character given to us by the transforming power of God. Just as God is "set apart and separate" we also should be set apart from the world's sinful activities, values, beliefs and philosophies.

I recently read what Desmond Tutu said about leadership. Each sentence was full of humility, leadership, love and challenge. He spoke on the idea of living a life that is beyond you. A life where you live at your best so that others can as well. His idea was this: a person is a person through other persons. You are you because of others. We copy the best attributes of others to be the best version of ourselves.
